



# **ISRAEL & GREECE: 13 LIFE-CHANGING DAYS**

## Day to Day itinerary

## **29 Apr Mon - DAY 1**

We leave the States for a journey to the land where the Bible will unfold before our eyes. We will walk, see, feel, and touch the roots of our faith, encounter the divine, and sense His presence.

#### 30 Apr Tue - DAY 2

Flying over the Atlantic Ocean and Europe, we reach the shores of God's land. Upon our arrival at the Ben

Gurion Airport, we will be met by our guide and continue to our hotel, located on the beautiful shores of the Mediterranean Sea,

for a wonderful buffet dinner and a good night's rest.

### 01 May Wed - DAY 3

After a rich Israeli breakfast, we begin our tour of Israel at Caesarea, the city of Cornelius the Centurion, the

first GenIle convert

(Acts 10). We visit the Roman theatre, walk on the pier used by the apostle Paul on his way to Rome, and see the impressive water

aqueduct built by Herod the Great. Leaving the Mediterranean, we will travel north to Mt. Carmel, where Elijah held the contest

with 450 prophets of Baal (I Kings 18). After lunch, we travel to Tel Megiddo, or Armageddon, for a short tour of the remains from

Solomon's days (I Kings 9). Here, we experience a magnificent view of the Valley of Jezreel (Armageddon) and see the significance

of this site for the end of days (Rev. 16). As we continue our trip to Galilee, we stop at the Nazareth Village, demonstrating life in

first-century Nazareth. At the end of the day, we will drive by Cana of Galilee, where Jesus performed His first miracle at the wedding

feast (John 2) before we continue to our hotel in the beautiful region of Galilee for dinner and rest.

#### 02 May Thu - DAY 4

Today will be dedicated to the spectacular northern part of Israel. Following the accounts described in the Gospel of Luke chapter 9,

we will drive through the Hula Valley to reach Mt. Hermon, mentioned in Psalm 133. We will visit the Banias, one of the headwaters

of the Jordan River, and the site of Caesarea Philippi, where Peter confessed Christ's divinity. From there, we continue to the Dan

Nature Reserve. After a refreshing walk through the beautiful reserve, we discover Jeroboam's Altar (I Kings 12). We will also see a

city gate from the Ime of Abraham the Patriarch and learn about the importance of the gate in the social life of the city in the Old

Testament Imes. Then, at Korazim, one of the ci-es cursed by Jesus (Mat. 11:20-24), we will visit the beau-ful synagogue made of

basalt. We will no-ce a carved seat used by the community's most respected members, known in ancient sources as the Moses Seat

(Mat. 23: 1-7). We will also see the ancient ritual bath that has been reconstructed near the synagogue, along with two large

dwellings.) We continue our journey to the Mount of BeaOtudes, where Christ preached the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), where we

can appreciate the beautiful surroundings and views unchanged since the Ime Jesus delivered his seminal sermon. After an optional

lunch of St. Peter's Fish, the next stop is Tabgha, where Jesus performed the miracle of feeding the 5,000 (Mafhew 14), followed by

a visit to the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter, or Mensa ChrisO, where Jesus reappeared and made breakfast for His disciples after

His resurrection (John 21). Our next stop is Capernaum or Kfar Nahum, where Jesus resided during His ministry (Matthew 4). We

then visit the ongoing excavations at Magdala, home of Mary Magdalene, with its freshly excavated synagogue, where Jesus surely taught.

## **03 May Fri - DAY 5**

We start the day with a spectacular boat ride on the Sea of Galilee and a visit to Ginosar, where we will see the remains of a

fisherman's vessel discovered on the shores of the Sea of Galilee dating from the Ime of Jesus. Leaving the Sea of Galilee behind

us, we go to the Yardenit BapOsmal Site, where those who wish can be baptized in the waters of the Jordan River, as Jesus was.

We will then drive through the Jordan River Valley by Mt. Gilboa to Beth Shean (1 Sam. 31), built where the Jezreel Valley meets

the Jordan Valley. Here, we tour the amazing Roman-ByzanIne remains of the leading city of the Decapolis

mentioned in the

Gospels. We will walk the ancient streets and view the Roman steam baths, theatre, coliseum, market, and temples. Continuing

through the valley, we enter the Judean Desert, where we will pass ancient Jericho (Josh. 3) and view from a distance this city,

famed as the oldest in the world. To the east of Jericho along the Jordan River Valley (Queser El Yehud) is the Israeli side of Bethany

Beyond the Jordan. In this area, Jesus was born by John the Bapist, Elijah, and Elisha crossed the Jordan, and the children of

Israel, led by Joshua, entered the Promised Land. We will then ride on a portion of the Old Jericho Road, once used by pilgrims to

ascend to Jerusalem in Jesus' days. As we make a stop along the desolate road, we will learn the meaning of Psalm 121 and better

understand the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25). We will also view one of the amazing, isolated monasteries of the area,

where the monks slll try to follow the example of Jesus on the Mount of TemptaOon. Crossing a part of the Wilderness of Judea,

we will become acquainted with the Bedouin life and start ascending to JERUSALEM, and for the first time, get to see the Golden

City of the Mighty King. A wonderful hotel and dinner await us.

#### 04 May Sat - DAY 6

We will spend today exploring the Judean Desert. We will pass the "Inn of the Good Samaritan" on the ancient route pilgrims would

have followed to Jerusalem on our way to the shores of the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth. Following the coast of the Dead

Sea, we will arrive at Masada, the tabletop fortress built by King Herod and used by Jewish Zealots for their last stand against the

Roman Empire. Having toured the site, we will continue to the desert oasis of En Gedi, prominent in King Saul's pursuit of the young

David (1 Sam. 23-24). Following lunch, you are invited to take a short float in the mineral-rich lake of the Dead Sea before continuing

to Qumran, where an ancient Jewish sect chose to live at the Ime of Jesus and where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered.

## <u>05 May Sun - DAY 7</u>

After breakfast, We will spend the morning at Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus, and the Church of the NaOvity, the oldest Church

in the Holy Land; admire the ancient limestone columns and remains of mosaic floors; descend to the Grofo of Nalvity, where a

silver star in the floor marks the spot where Christ is believed to have been born. We will also visit the Shepherds' Fields, where

David raised his sheep, and where the Good News about Jesus' birth was received (Luke 2). After lunch, we head back to Jerusalem,

to the area surrounding Mount Moriah, where we will visit the Western Wall and the Ophel Archaeological Park and Museum,

with remains of the city streets and Temple steps Jesus would have walked on (Luke 19, Mafhew 21). This is also the place where

Peter delivered his sermon on the day of Pentecost, and 5,000 were added to the Church. We will visit the City of David and

Hezekiah's Tunnel, ending at the Pool of Siloam, before ascending Mount Zion to visit Peter in Gallicantu, believed to be the site

of Caiaphas' house and dungeons (Luke 22), as well as the Upper Room, where Jesus celebrated the Last Supper, and the disciples

were filled with the Spirit on the day of Pentecost.

#### 06 May Mon - DAY 8

We begin the day at the Mt. of Olives with a magnificent overview of Jerusalem and an explanation of its history. We will walk in

the footsteps of Jesus down the Palm Sunday Road to the Garden of Gethsemane, the site of Jesus' betrayal (Luke 22). Here, we

will have a special devotional Ime in the Garden before continuing to St. Stephen Gate to enter the old city. We will visit the Pools

of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the lame man (John 5). After an Ime of singing in St. Anne's Church, we make our way to the Ecce

Homo Convent and stand at the site of Pilate's condemnation and flogging of Jesus (John 19). We will continue by the Way of the

Cross out of the Damascus Gate and finish our day by celebrating Communion at the Garden Tomb, the site of Golgotha, and the

Empty Tomb. Return to hotel for a farewell dinner and prepare for travel to Athens.

#### 07 May Tue - DAY 9

We check out from our hotel, and we will visit the Israel Museum, including the Dead Sea Scrolls housed in the iconic Shrine of the

Book and the impressive model of Jerusalem from the Second Temple Period. We make our way to Ben Gurion airport, where we

begin the second part of our tour – Athens, Greece. Upon arrival in Athens, you are met by your guide and bus driver. Transfer to

your hotel with the rest of the day at leisureâ€"dinner and overnight at the hotel.

#### 08 May Wed - DAY 10

Today, we explore Athens, one of the most glorious cities in the world and the cradle of Western civilization as we know it today.

For twenty-five centuries, the panorama of this city has been dominated by the Areopagus, the rock of the Acropolis; we see the

ruins of the Parthenon, the Erechtheion, and the Propylaea. We will ascend Mars Hill where Paul spoke to the ancient Athenians

about the one and only God (Acts 17). From here we have an excellent view of the ancient agora, the former center of Athenian

public life. ARernoon at leisure. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

## 09 May Thu - DAY 11

We board this morning our coach for Corinth, taking the coastal road along the Saronic Gulf to the Corinth Canal, which connects

the Aegean Sea with the Ionian Sea. Short stop for pictures and continue to the site of ancient Corinth, Paul's beloved city and the site

of his most extensive ministry (Acts 18). Dominated by the Acro-Corinth rising 1700 feet above the ruins, the marketplace is laid

out exactly as it stood in the days of the great Apostle. We see the Bema (the judgment seat) where Paul stood before Gallio and

preached (Acts 18). The museum contains a superb collection of artifacts portraying life in ancient Corinth. Time for leisure at the

port of Cenchreae (Acts 18). Return to Athens for dinner and overnight.

Transfer to the airport for your flight home, with the life-long memories of a marvelous, life-changing journey.



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
